5) The Mobilising Leader - Mobilising leaders build away from themselves

Why and how we build through others

Big call to action is "Don't focus on church growth, focus on church mobilisation"

Ephesians 4:11-16 (NIV)

11 So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers,
12 to <u>equip</u> his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up
13 until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.

The leadership and ministry gifts Jesus gives the church are designed to EQUIP - like push starting a car - to MOBILISE the people of God

5 BIG REASONS WHY YOU SHOULD BE A MOBILISING LEADERS:

- 1. GROWTH: A mobilised church will grow (vs 12, 16)
- 2. UNITY: A mobilised church will be <u>united</u> (vs 13, 16)
- 3. MATURITY: A mobilised church will mature into Christlikeness (13, 16)
- 4. STABILITY: A mobilised church becomes **anchored** against mission and doctrine drift (vs 14)
- 5. DIVERSITY: A mobilised church becomes <u>well rounded</u> in Christ like expression through diversity of gifting (vs 15) "in every respect"

Shifting for the WHY to the HOW

1. Mobilising leaders are not control freaks!

Part 5: Mobilising leaders build away from themselves

What does that mean? To build away from yourself means building away from <u>dependance</u> on you as a leader.

- It means to lead in a way that even if you as the leader are not there, the organisation , church or meetings can continue
- ILLUST: Asked many pastors if they take a holiday
 - No, the church can't function without them
 - Certainly makes you feel very important
 - But truth is it's bad leadership!
 - You have built dependency into your team and organisation
 - That dependency holds the team and the organisation back

ILLUST: Have a friend who runs a business but has been planning a three week trip away

- So began to train the staff to manage and run the business in his absence
- At first they pushed back can't do it
- But then they began to grow and the team has grown from a team of servant minded people to a team of

leadership minded people

- He benefited by having a holiday. And his team benefited by learning to think and operate as leaders

Jesus was the Master of this - He knew that he only had three years with his team

- And so he led them in a way that they could operate without him being there physically
- He gave them his Spirit, the Holy Spirit, and taught them to trust the Holy Spirit and not depend on his
 physical presence with them

John 16:7 (NIV)

7 But very truly I tell you, <u>it is for your good that I am going away</u>. Unless I go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you.

This is an amazing thought - what could be better than having Jesus with us?

- Learning to do the work of Jesus with the Holy Spirit with us

HIW DID JESUS BUILD AWAY FROM HIMSELF?

1. He spent time building a close relationship with them so that they caught his heart

Mark 3:14 (NIV)

14 He appointed twelve that they might <u>be with him</u> and that he might send them out to preach

Tyrone Daniel "It is easy to give people a manual. It's harder for people to catch your heart"

TO BUILD AWAY FROM YOURSELF, YOUR TEAM NEEDS TO CATCH YOUR HEART

2. <u>He included them in what he was doing</u>

They were part of the daily ministry

- They had opportunity to ask questions and learn from him on the job
- He trained them as he ministered
- He shared his heart with them

John 15:15 (NIV)

15 I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you.

TO BUILD AWAY FROM YOURSELF, YOU SHOULD ALWAYS BE INVESTING IN YOUR TEAMS GROWTH

3. He let them practice while he was with them

Luke 9:1-2 (NIV)

1 When Jesus had called the Twelve together, he gave them power and authority to drive out all demons and to cure diseases, 2 and <u>he sent them out</u> to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal the sick.

Quote "The only way you can know if you can trust someone is... to trust them"

Jesus prepared them by getting them to do what he was doing

- He risked with them
- The result was that they grew!

TO BUILD AWAY FROM YOURSELF, YOU NEED TO TAKE RISKS BY GIVING YOUR TEAM OPPORTUNITIES TO TRY AND POSSIBLY FAIL

4. <u>He left them</u>

Acts 1:8-9 (NIV)

8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

9 After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight.

Jesus literally ascended to heaven

- He commissioned them instructing them to continue and multiply what he had been doing
- And then left!

TO BUILD AWAY FROM YOURSELF, YOU HAVE TO LEARN TO LEAVE YOUR TEAM TO GET ON WITH IT

BIG IDEA: If you are always there your team will only grow to a certain level

- To keep them growing, you have to get going!
