The Leadership style of James

INTRODUCTION: These are the Leadership styles of James.

- 1. He led with HUMILITY
- 2. He led with COURAGE
- 3. He led with TRUTH
- 4. He led with ACTION

James was an action man.

Listen to how the Apostle Paul greets the saints in Philippi:

Philippians 1:3-6 (NIV)³I thank my God every time I remember you. ⁴ In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy ⁵ because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, ⁶ being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.

Now listen to how James greets the saints: "Greetings"

That's it. Then straight into the action. Man of action not words.

Here is an example from his letter:

James 2:16-17 (NIV) ¹⁶ If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? ¹⁷ In the same way, <u>faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.</u>

The leadership of James is characterised by ACTION.

- He taught that real faith is measured by action
- And any claim to faith without action is DEAD.
- His whole letter to the saints is full of ACTION practical living

BIG IDEA: LEADERS ARE NOT CALLED FO BE TALKERS BUT DOERS

Eg. My wife has taught me this over the years

- I'm a planner and ponderer
- I would love everything to be perfectly planned out and thought through and then act
- She is the opposite she is just start something

And yes some leaders might need to take a moment and learn to at least pray for they launch into something

- but for many like me, we need to be more action orientated
- Less talk. Less dreaming and scheming and more ACTION.

Ecclesiastes 11:4 (NIV) 4 Whoever watches the wind will not plant; whoever looks at the clouds will not reap.

If you are always waiting for the perfect conditions

- Perfect time
- Perfectly clear word from God
- Perfect economy
- Perfect people
- You will achieve nothing!

Eg. Church building - the economy had just dipped, many folk had been retrenched, we didn't have even a tenth of the money

- But we felt that God had spoken and so we just launched
- Real faith demands action and action results in more faith

Sometimes we hold back and sound wise when our procrastination is in fact rooted in FEAR of LAZINESS

Genesis 26:1-3 (NIV)¹ Now there was a famine in the land—besides the previous famine in Abraham's time—and Isaac went to Abimelek king of the Philistines in Gerar. ² The LORD appeared to Isaac and said, "Do not go down to Egypt; live in the land where I tell you to live. ³ Stay in this land for a while, and I will be with you and will bless you. For to you and your descendants I will give all these lands and will confirm the oath I swore to your father Abraham.

Genesis 26:12 (NIV)¹² Isaac planted crops in that land and the same year reaped a hundredfold, because the LORD blessed him.

There was a famine in the land - wisdom would dictate to wait for the first rains

But God had spoken and so Isaac jumped into action

Challenge:

John Maxwell story: "Do it now!" fifty times before getting out of bed!

BIG IDEA: Leaders are men and woman of ACTION
